## **APRIL'S TEAM LETTER**

#### Wake up call

There are some nights when you think the morning is never going to come. Some infection has you in a feverish grip where dreams take you down a nightmare spiral. You feel enclosed in some prison of the night from which there is no escape. And when the morning comes, it arrives like a kind of miracle. The door to the cell is flung open and light floods in. It feels like resurrection.

In the biblical accounts of the resurrection the event takes place in the morning. The stone is rolled from the tomb and light floods in. The wonderful Welsh poet R S Thomas captures this in his Easter poem: He wrote:

The grave clothes of winter are still here, but the sepulchre is empty. A messenger from the tomb tells us how a stone has been rolled from the mind . . .

"A stone has been rolled from the mind." Maybe that's as close as we get to resurrection. When a worry, or a burden, or a fear is removed from us and suddenly we can see that life is possible once more. I can remember that feeling when – a couple of years back – my surgeon gave me the all clear after a prostate operation.

I am constantly amazed at people's ability to bounce back from adversity and loss. We all carry scars from the past – as did the risen Jesus when he appeared to his disciples – but with the help of friends, family and (very often) a sustaining faith, we start again. I believe that this is a spiritual, as well as a physical and mental, renewal. It's almost impossible to disentangle one from the other, but somehow that apparently un-budgeable stone can be rolled away.

This is Easter. The night can pass. The day can come. We will rise. It's a kind of miracle.

At our March meeting we discussed Vera Brittain's 'Testament of Youth'. Born into a middle class family, Vera soon found out that education and life generally was a different prospect for her. She did not receive the same opportunities as her brother and had few personal freedoms. Her fiance, brother and friend went to serve in WW1 and Vera trained as a nurse. They corresponded by letter and these letters together with her diaries formed her memoir which became one of the most powerful accounts of that time. The loss of her fiance, brother and friend and a generation of young men was profound. The war changed Vera in many ways and afterwards she completed her degree and worked as a writer and political commentator. The book prompted a lot of discussion but some did feel it was quite long (some 600 pages) and over detailed but it did say a lot about the social structures of that time and the hollowness of the 'victory' of winning the war when so much else was lost.

#### Roy Edward Beckett RIP

The funeral service for Roy, who died peacefully at home on February 12th after a long illness, took place in Wangford Church on Friday March 1st, attended by a large congregation of family, friends, neighbours and former colleagues. It was followed by a private committal at Waveney Memorial Park Crematorium.

Roy was born near Alexandra Palace in London in 1936. He was an only child, and his grandfather Bill, who lived with them, was an important figure in his childhood. Bill taught him to fish, to garden, and how to fix things. The young Roy was also a chorister at his local church. After a move to Southend, Roy attended Southend High School for Boys. On leaving school at 16, he worked in an office in London until National Service in the Royal Army Service Corps, and saw service at Suez. On his return to Southend he went to work for Shell Petroleum in the Strand office, remaining with them for 30 years.

Roy met Val through an ecumenical church youth group, whose members travelled to Liverpool Street by train each day - ideal for a courtship. They married on a grey St Valentine's Day in 1959. Daughters Carolyn and Julie came along in 1962 and 1965.

Roy transferred to the Wirral in 1966, where the family were very happy. On his return to the London office in 1975 they lived in Shenfield, although Roy spent two years in Nigeria teaching computer skills to the local staff. Roy later retired early after suffering some serious illnesses, and the family moved to Suffolk.

Roy was always involved in voluntary work, whether as an officer in the Boys Brigade, a fundraiser for the various churches he attended, or as a Samaritan. In Suffolk he also worked for the CAB, and in the BREAK and East Coast Hospice shops in Southwold. He also started the Wangford Men's Breakfast.

Very much a family man, Roy was very proud of his daughters and grandchildren, and was thrilled by the birth of his great-granddaughter Abigail Trixie.

Unfortunately, the cancer which had plagued him for many years finally took over his whole body, and, after the many hospitalisations and complex surgery, all borne with great stoicism, Roy came home to be cared for by Val, Carolyn and Julie.

Donations in memory of Roy were made to Wangford Church Restoration Fund, and his ashes were buried in the churchyard.

## **ABRAHAM**

Liam Neeson's comments that he wanted to wreak revenge after a friend confessed that she'd been raped by a black man gets no condemnation from me. Who among us (and Christ had a few words to say about such things) has not harboured unclean thoughts seeking retribution? Thinking and executing are entirely different and most of us would retreat from the actual deed. What intrigues me most about the Neeson piece is the fact that he chose to voice his thoughts to, of all people, a journalist. Surely he has enough nous about him to realise that saying anything faintly controversial to the scab fourth estate is just plain daft.

I am suspicious about revisionism, particularly uttered by someone commenting about long gone events he could not have possibly witnessed. A Labour politician, by name of John McDonnell (me neither) labels Winston Churchill a villain because he sent more than 200 police officers along with armed soldiers to break up a miners' picket line in Tonypandy, South Wales in 1910. I expect there are numerous folk who lived in Churchill's lifetime such as myself, who have divided opinions about him. I suspect that the people of the Channel Islands may well have a grievance for his leaving them to the fate of German invasion. There seems little doubt that the man was flawed but aren't we all? He could be racist, cruel and anti-trade unionist. However I hope we shall remember him for having a powerful brain, being a mighty orator and leading this country through the most troubled years. He showed leadership when it mattered most and his gigantic light will continue to shine brightly long after the dim candles of pygmies like McDonnell have been snuffed.

District Council to celebrate their 45 years in existence before they merge with Waveney D.C. does not bother me very much. After all, the amount is relatively minor compared to the Council's total expenditure. Nevertheless, there will be folk out there telling us that the money could be better spent elsewhere and I would likely agree with them. What intrigues me is the selection process of who will be invited to this back-slapping jolly. Will anyone who was around in 1974 be there? Will it be stuffed out with dopey Councillors and even dopier Chief Officers? I doubt very much if any foot soldiers past and present will be there.

I shall never weary of banging the drum on behalf of the travelling community although no-one seems to be listening to the beat and you may be fed up about me going on about it again, so I shall be brief. The General Synod of the Church of England has decreed that the Church should donate land for gipsies and travellers. So far, so good but the precise methodology has to be determined.
