

APRIL'S TEAM LETTER

'Softly as I leave you, softly as I leave you now'.

These words for the title song made famous by Matt Monro in the 1960s sprang to mind as I write this letter on the day Canon Simon Pitcher and his wife Rene leave Sole Bay to begin a new life and ministry in Lavenham. I have worked alongside Simon for nearly seven years and in that time we learnt a lot about how to work successfully as a team and to support each other in difficult times, but also enjoyed celebrating together in the happiest of moments. Simon is going to be hard to replace and I pray that the person who is appointed is the right person for Sole Bay to move the churches and communities forward in this place.

I am very grateful to my fellow clergy, Judy, Malcolm, Philip, Stephen, Margaret, Harry, Robert our Reader and Hugh our licenced preacher, for all the cover they will provide during the interregnum. I cannot thank them enough for what could be a period of at least 8 months.

Even though Simon's farewell service fell at the beginning of Lent it was a most joyful occasion with over 250 people from our church family, the local communities and further afield who came to give thanks to God for Simon's ministry. The music and liturgy were very uplifting and a celebration cake with a train affixed to the top was literally 'the icing on the cake'!

There is a lot to look forward to and I encourage us all to get involved in Holy Week so that we all can share in the final week of Christ's life, his suffering and his death but also the wonder and joy of his resurrection. We will be considering the 7 sayings or words that Jesus spoke from the cross on the first three days of Holy Week and Good Friday. On Maundy Thursday we will be having a Holy Communion Service to mark the day when Jesus celebrated his Last Supper and then will experience the Tenebrae (Shadowing) liturgy as we recall the hours when darkness reigned as Jesus was arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane and then tortured and finally killed. We will be using music from Karl Jenkins, The Armed Man and meditative poems. The service ends dramatically. Do come along at 8pm and experience this service, perhaps for the first time. On Good Friday there will be an Ecumenical Service in St Edmund's at 10.00am, followed by a Walk of Witness to South Green and then we will mark the last hour of Jesus' life in St Margaret's, Reydon at 2pm. On Easter Day there will be many celebrations in our churches to mark our Lord's resurrection and they will begin with a Sunrise service at 7.30am on Walberswick Beach. So, please all feel invited to come along and share in our worship at Easter.



Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA)

The Parish Councillors are looking for feedback with regard to repairs to the MUGA. The area is currently closed and in need of repair or renovation. The options are:

- to repair the damaged timber fencing around the perimeter and restain, at an estimated cost of about £3,500;
- to completely replace the fencing at an estimated cost of about £12,000+ (material costs are rising all the time);
- to keep it closed for the time being and not carry out any repair.

Book Club

ABRAHAM

Writers in the Times recently suggested their rules for life, an awful lot with tongue in cheek. I thought 'I can do that' - I'm conceited enough. Off we go, and feel free to disagree. 1. Make all your mistakes as soon as possible and then repeat them 50 years later. It's fun. 2. Distrust all politicians from the off. It saves time. 3. Whether you're lonely or not get at least one cat. 4. Never apologise. Just make sure you don't do anything for which you have to apologise. 5. When at the pub, with or without your spouse, leave that infernal machine at home.

6. Take time to smell the flowers and anything else that grows. 7. Don't waste your time trying to put dickheads down. Give them time, they will manage it themselves. 8. Try to avoid talking about yourself. You're just not that interesting. 9. Being off your face with booze is so unattractive. 10. If you've found a friend that makes you laugh, hang on to them.

Still on B's and second shelf - Dirk Bogarde - 2 books on a fine British actor; Napoleon Bonaparte, alas yet to be read, as is Charlotte Bronte; John Brown : Queen Victoria's Highland Servant - an interesting read (try to cast aside the memory of Billy Connolly and Judi Dench); George Mackay Brown - 6 volumes about the great chronicler and poet of the Orkney Islands. George Borrow : Oulton and Beyond - terrific read about the gypsy scholar poet who lived at Oulton; and finally for now, 7 books on the one and only Rupert Brooke, my favourite poet. He died, appropriately, on St George's Day 1915, aged 27, forever young and forever associated with the village of Granchester. He wrote The Old Vicarage, Granchester in 1912 in his favourite cafe in Berlin and to my mind it has the most wonderful romantically sentimental lines ever written about Old Blighty. 'God! I will pack, and take a train / And get me to England once again! / For England's the one land, I know / Where men with splendid hearts may go'.

When making a request for something, how often have you been given the dreaded response "No worries", or even worse, "No problem". How to respond? How about just be curt and tell the offender not to use the expression? An insidious trend indeed. Suggestions to the sainted editor will be welcomed.

At our March meeting we discussed "Rabbit Hole" by Mark Billingham. The story was set in a hospital dealing with mental health issues and looked at the murder of a patient and a nurse. The narrative unfolded through the first person account of one of the residents - Alice - who described herself as having worked with the police. We discussed the various events that led to other residents being at the hospital, from anorexia, witnessing one parent kill another, fetishism and powerlessness to cope. A huge range of characters and issues prevailed. It was quite a complicated narrative. . Very few of us anticipated the ending - Alice was a civilian employee at the police station and her former colleague did not tell her this and used her to help him cope with the aftermath of seeing his partner killed on duty. Alice had PTSD and we felt outlining the personality and physical problems associated with the condition and the impact on her family and friends was very well done. The narrative ended on an apologetic email her former policeman colleague sent to explain matters and stopped when he was about to press 'send'. We do not know if the email was sent or whether it would have made any difference. We came to see the fragility of human interaction, and the unlikely friendships and alliances formed were quite affirming. It was noted that the cover did look foreboding and reminiscent of an institution with a closed door, hospital ward, and one chair in the corridor which enforced the idea of a tortuous and lonely interrogation to strip the characters bare to find where truth was located. In summary, it was a good book to read and generated a lot of discussion. We next meet on Thursday April 6th at 8pm in the community centre to discuss Mitch Albom's "The Magic Strings of Frankie Presto".
