#### Our new Sole Bay Team Rector



It is with anticipation and thanksgiving that we are able to announce that the Reverend Russ Gant has been appointed as the Team Rector of the Sole Bay Benefice of Churches. Russ is married to Jenny (a Canadian) and they have two daughters Annabelle (13) and Elizabeth (10) and a very important cat called Dinah (age unknown).

Russ is currently Vicar of St. James' Church, Rowledge in the Diocese of Guildford where he has been incumbent for the last 7 years. Prior to this, he served his curacy at St. Paul's Church, Camberley - a large urban parish serving, amongst others, the Royal Military Academy at Sandhurst.

Russ trained for ordination at Cranmer Hall, St. John's College, Durham. He is Suffolk born and bred, growing up in Bacton, near Stowmarket. He came to faith unexpectedly as an adult and is surprised but delighted that God has called him to full time ministry.

Prior to ordination Russ trained in landscape and amenity planning, with a subsequent degree in business studies. His last "proper" job was as Town Clerk and Chief Executive Officer of Diss Town Council, in Norfolk.

As yet, we are unable to confirm when Russ' licensing service will take place, as this is subject to completion of the usual DBS and safeguarding procedures.

Thank you all for your prayers for this process thus far. Please continue to pray for Russ, Jenny, Annabelle and Elizabeth as they prepare to leave a place that they have grown to love as they follow God's call on their lives.

#### **Book Club**

At our July meeting we discussed Melissa Harrison's "All Among the Barley". Several members of the group had read her books and listened to her podcasts and were familiar with her work on the natural world. The beautifully constructed narrative was set in 1933 between the wars and the Great Depression. The references to old farming practices were evocative and informative - reminding us of the importance of not forgetting how life was once lived. Generally, we all felt that there was so much in this book that at times it was difficult to unpick it and relate events and thoughts. The story is told through the eyes of the central character Edith. Firstly as a young girl, and latterly as a 70 year old woman who had spent the majority of her life in an institution. Under the surface tranquility was turbulence. Connie arrived in the village as a journalist, wanting to talk about the "old ways" and that they should never be forgotten. We came, via a village meeting, to see that, under the surface of her investigation into rural life was a political purpose and that Connie represented nationalism at its worst. The quiet farmhand who rarely said a word completely understood her position and challenged it, standing up to Edith's father who appeared to share her views. Villagers were vulnerable and many in dire financial trouble which made them easy targets, but the meeting had unforeseen consequences. Edith's father set fire to the farm and disappeared, which became a catalyst for events. Edith willingly went to an institution, she assumed her brother farmed what was left of their land (she could not do it as a female), and her mother happily spent her remaining life with the farmhand who had spoken out. The story ended with Edith leaving the institution for life in the community. So much in this book and an excellent book for discussion.

We next meet at 8 pm on Thursday 3rd August at the Community Centre to discuss Ambrose Parry's "The Way of All Flesh".





#### **ABRAHAM**

A chum very kindly loaned to me a sporting biography indicating that I could keep it as he would not wish at any time to reread it. Fair enough. I am sitting in my little room and behind me are some 100 sporting volumes, all of which I have read and am not likely to do so again. Also behind and to my left are many and varied volumes of reference books on probably every possible subject and I keep them in case someone out there asks me to compile a pub quiz or two. Including biblical studies, which reminds me; it is quite a while since I last read the Authorised Version. I must have another good look if for no other reason than to, as W. C Fields put it, see what loopholes I can find. In full view in front of me are 48 Pevsners describing at different times all the important buildings in England county by county plus those in London. Of the four Scottish volumes I shall take the Fife one to Scotland later this year and I always keep the revised East and West Suffolk ones to hand. The A. S. Neill books I shall keep forever with the others about private schools, a fascination for me. I wonder where and why I acquired so many. I can recall a highlight here and there but thousands? In my short time visiting Southwold I can remember 5 second hand bookshops and now none. By now, you may have gathered that books are important to me. I read them but that is only a small part of their import. They are beautiful to see and feel and they do furnish a room. They comfort me and keep me warm as I dream.

I am seriously hoping that the pupil reported as wishing to be identified as a cat, answering every question asked of her in lessons by meowing, was taking the mickey out of a deranged woke teacher. Either way, this is yet another example of pupils running the academy as they wish and sidestepping the teacher completely. Just in case, however, the little one truly believes she is a pussy cat (how many of us have professed to want to return in another life as a mog?) I asked Mrs Abe who had a career dealing with children how she would handle the little darling, and she replied that she would ask him/her to curl up in a corner and, if they behaved, she would give them some Dreamies as a treat. Job done.

Yet in class, it is gratifying to hear that Latin is enjoying a resurgence. Latin and Greek form the root of the majority of words in English and English is still the most widely spoken of languages. An early grounding in Latin grammar, bases, stems and prefixes will provide a youngster with a fine start in mastering the mother language. Lay aside the elitist attitude to the oft derided "dead language" and make it available to all children. It will aid them immeasurably in later life. It worked for me.

In contrast the decline in learning an instrument in state schools is cutting off a pipeline of talent to choirs and orchestras throughout the country. Recruitment of youngsters to music academies will soon be restricted to those from private schools or from personal tuition financed by parents. My volunteering at the Red House at Aldeburgh has reinforced my belief in the power that music holds to enhance folks' lives. It doesn't have to be classical or any other form of music. It only has to be sounds that are joyful to listen to and cheer you up. There always seems to be sufficient funds from central government for daft minority projects so there should not be a problem finding money to pay music teachers. Blindingly obvious.

Tony Hancock was always for me the greatest comic actor. Terrific words provided by Galton and Simpson, uttered with perfect timing by the 'lad' himself never failed to cheer me, even after he ditched his regular set of chums - Sid James, Hattie Jacques, Kenneth Williams and the under-rated Bill Kerr. Not an expletive or crude word in sight. The strongest phrase ever said was 'stone me'. BBC4 repeated an episode recently which featured Tony taking an aeroplane flight and ending up in a hotel for some funny business. Dreadful. I didn't laugh once. I suppose even Tony and the lads couldn't get it right every time. Serves him right for throwing his friends under a bus. This was followed by an episode of Whatever Happened To The Likely Lads? which, mercifully, did stand up. Two childhood mates, Bob trying to achieve maturity but being dragged back to the past by Terry. Magic. Who wants to grow up?

Right up to date, I am yet persevering with Coronation Street; goodness knows why, it drives Mrs Abe round the bend. The acting is sound but the storylines are ridiculous and misery rules.
