#### **DECEMBER'S TEAM LETTER**

'Small wonder the star, small wonder the light The angels in chorus, the shepherds in fright; But stable and manger for God, no small wonder!'

I love singing and listening to carols and am impatient from Advent Sunday onwards to begin listening to them. This beautifully simple, yet profound carol called "No Small Wonder" written by the former bus driver Paul Wigmore with music by Paul Edwards has caught my imagination again this year. Christ's birth that we celebrate on 25th December is the greatest wonder of all, yet it is in utter simplicity and humility that God becomes one with us as a human being, which we call the 'incarnation'.

'Small wonder the kings, small wonder they bore The gold and the incense, the myrrh, to adore; The God gives his life on a cross, no small wonder!'

The best carols tell the story of Jesus' birth with a poignant reminder of his ultimate sacrifice for us all on the cross. God who was and is always present in creation has come to be born, live, grow, suffer, and die like us and with us here on earth. God in Jesus was not here to stay for a time and then leave us, but to remain with us always. As a result of Christ's birth all creation is restored and God chooses to save us from sin and death forever.

Whether our life this year has been easy or hard, Christ has shared in our joys and in your sorrows, because that is the essence of incarnation – God becomes one with us so that there is nothing in human experience that is alien to God. God knows what it is like to feel vulnerable, cold, lonely, uncertain, homeless, sad, broken by suffering and ultimately dying and rising again. God has said 'yes' to human life unconditionally and as a result has made our own life journey with him hallowed and beautified.

By God becoming human, God has raised up humanity to a divine level where we can potentially be like him.

On behalf of all the churches in the Sole Bay Team I would like to wish you all a very happy and peaceful Christmas where you, and those you love, might know the joy and wonder of the incarnation.

I leave you with the last verse of the carol:

'Small wonder the love, small wonder the grace, The power, the glory, the light of his face; But all to redeem my poor heart, no small wonder!'

# SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL MINERAL EXTRACTION

Due to a ruling from the EU Court of Justice, the 'People over Wind' judgement, Suffolk County Council have had to produce an Appropriate Assessment to support their Minerals and Waste Local Plan, which includes the proposed extension of Wangford Quarry, and on legal advice, have introduced a further public consultation period, which ends on 17th December at 5.00 pm.

The book told the story of Jess: a capable woman having a career, her child with special needs, relationships and friendships and how her understanding of other lives sustained her. A criticism would be the sheer amount of other stories woven in by naming and identifying so many events, explorers, thinkers and practices.

#### **ABRAHAM**

Mrs Abe and I had a couple of Scottish capers in the last two months. First was a concert from the two lads who spent their formative years in dear old 'Muchty, Charlie and Craig Reid. aka Proclaimers. This took place the Theatre Royal, Norwich, a place I had never hitherto been, and everything was superb, including the driver, dear Mark. If it hadn't been for him we would have had to walk what would seem like 500 miles.

The visit last month was to the Orkney archipelago to listen to some traditional story tellers and beautiful singing. Magic. This four day festival was organised and run (with a little help from her friends) by one Fran Flett Hollinrake, known to me forever as Frances, whom we have known since birth. Two events per day and we attended all but the first, which was the only outside event, done by Frances, in a cemetery overflowing with her

Flett ancestors. She advised her mum that the weather wasn't too good and that her old dad might not be able to cope with the slippery, uneven ground. Charming. The last afternoon was spent in a small, beautifully furnished and cluttered little function room called Betty's Reading Room. This was situated in the hamlet of Tingwall, which boasted the ferry terminal to the isle of Rousay. The couple who managed and ran the Room were retired teachers straight out of the sixties and were magnificent. They truly informed us that in their time thev visited Southwold regularly and that their inspiration for Betty's came from the Sailors' Reading Room. There you go, from dear old East Suffolk to Orkney. By the way, on the way to Tingwall we were held up by a herd of cattle. That Sunday was the only sunshine day and when it is sunny up there it is truly spectacular.

The roads are straight and unblemished, not a pothole to be seen. The scenery was glorious and very tempting. Mention must be made of a trip to the second largest island, that is Hoy (as in Old Man Of), population some three hundred, where we were treated to a wartime tour by son-in-law Andy, finishing in a dinky little theatre in the middle of nowhere, to hear more stories. One story teller remarked that she had never been asked before if she wanted a sound check. So, a really memorable five days. And did it put us in the mood to relocate to be near to our little girl? Not half. But I knew what would happen. As soon as I boarded the plane I would be thinking about our cosy wee hoose with little Sparkle in our adoptive village and deciding I'm going nowhere. Still, never say never...

I have just read a book by Billy Connolly (yes, another one) entitled 'Made In Scotland' and it is a humdinger. There are a few parallels with Billy's and Mr and Mrs Abe's life. He is fiercely and proudly Scottish but after fifty years gone, will never live there again. Like-

wise. He is a rabid anglophile, although he dwells in LA. Likewise (the anglophile bit). He loves to visit Glasgow where he is a local hero but gets lost in it now, so many parts having changed. He'll always be a Partick man just as I'll forever be a 'Muchty boy and he's just as proud that he left. There is something, however, about which I disagree with him. He despises what he calls the 'Scottish shortbread people'; those traditional heather and kilt generations such as Andy Stewart, Ken McKellar and he has a particular animus against Harry Lauder. All of these people I liked and I have loved Harry ever since I learned that, after his son Captain John Lauder was killed at the Western Front, he wrote 'Keep Right On To The End Of The Road'. So there. In the same breath he loves the sound of bagpipes. Make your mind up, Bill.

Christmas and another year are fast approaching, the geese are getting fat and all that, and Mrs Abe has reminded me about ordering a consignment of Scotch pies. I wonder if Billy likes them
