End of Lockdown

As we go to press, and subject to parliamentary approval, Boris Johnson has announced the end of the lockdown, and a return to an amended 3-tier structure from December 2nd. Information about which tier each area is in will follow.

DECEMBER'S TEAM LETTER

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord, and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son our Saviour Jesus Christ.

(Third Collect from Evening Prayer - Book of Common Prayer)

As I am preparing this Christmas letter at the end of October the news today is that the number of infections of Coronavirus is increasing and another lockdown is a potential response to the pandemic. This has already happened in France and so the possibility of the same happening in the UK becomes ever more likely.

How do we respond to this? What hope can we find in God and each other this Christmas?

Jesus was born into a very dangerous and uncertain world like our own. He was born in poverty and laid in a manger in a cave designed for the keeping of animals. After Jesus was born, within a short period of time the Holy family fled into Egypt as refugees to escape the genocide of King Herod.

It is worth remembering that this was no ordinary birth, and that the Star of Bethlehem led the Shepherds and Wise Men to the manger where the Christ child was laid. In the darkness of that first Christmas night the light of a new star shone brightly transforming the darkness and marking the place where God became one of us, so that we would never feel lost and abandoned again.

This Christmas, the story of the birth of the Christ child should give us hope that the pandemic and the economic crisis that has ensued will not last forever and the truth of Immanuel, that 'God is really with us' is as true today as it was that first Christmas night.

As we look towards 2021, with most of us saying 'good riddance' to 2020 we should put our trust in God that He will deliver us and the nations of the world from the pandemic and that a fairer, greener, more just and more compassionate world will be realised for the benefit of every human being on Earth.

It was George VI, in his Christmas Day broadcast to the British Empire in 1939, just months after the Second World War had begun, who quoted the poem of Minnie Haskins (1875 – 1957) to offer hope and light at a time of world catastrophe. It is the same words of hope that I offer to you as we go into 2021.

I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year,

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown";

and he replied, "Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God.

That shall be to you better than a light, and safer than a known way."

Earlier in the year the volunteers of The Red House in Aldeburgh were taken on a day trip to Gresham's School in Holt primarily for the reason that Benjamin Britten attended and a music centre and concert hall are named after him. I was reminded of this when I read that a previous headmaster had died. His name was Logie Bruce Lockhart (with that splendid name he just had to be Scottish) and he served there from 1955 to 1982, well-liked and respected. Also at the school at the time was James Dyson's father who taught as a classics master. James and his brother were pupils. While there the father died and it seems that Logie Bruce Lockhart was instrumental in ensuring that the boys' education should continue without the added pressure of worrying about the fees.
