FEBRUARY'S TEAM LETTER

'Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ'.

These words that appear rather harrowing when we first hear them are the words that are said on Ash Wednesday when an individual receives a cross of ash upon their forehead as a mark of penitence and renewal. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, and 'being ashed' is a very fitting way for us to be reminded of our mortality, and also our ability as human beings, despite the best of intentions, 'to screw things up'. It is part of the human condition to make both small and big mistakes in our lives that can often, if we are honest with ourselves, leave us feeling wretched and sometimes wracked with guilt. I think that is why counsellors (some might say the present day priests of the 21st Century) have such long waiting lists of people wanting to see them to be able to learn to live with these feelings.

The Christian tradition has always acknowledged the human need to know that we are forgiven and that we in turn are asked to forgive, in order that we can continue living fulfilled lives. God does not want us to bear feelings of guilt for ever, but to recognise them for what they are, and leave them at the foot of the cross where we can be made whole once again. During Lent there are lots of opportunities for each of us to examine ourselves and explore our faith in greater depth and so may I wish us all a happy and holy Lent where we might learn to forgive ourselves and each other a little more.

The Ash Wednesday Service, which includes the opportunity for ashing, is at St Margaret's, Reydon on Wednesday 26 February at 7.30pm. All are welcome.

ABRAHAM

The old year has been dusted off but before it has been entirely forgotten, a little reminder about Christmas cards. It appears that very few people send them any more. Except that Mrs Abe and I do. And, bless your little hearts, quite some of our villagers do, as well as our grand old chums from far and wide. They have become unfashionable and expensive to buy and to send, also wasting planetary resources, we are told. Although the religious theme, regrettably, has all but been abandoned, I still love cards. Mrs Abe buys them, and the stamps, writes most of them and posts them - but I like receiving them. They make me start to feel Christmassy and they remind me of old friends whom I have not seen for a year or more. Some of the messages are cursory; some are chatty and informative and mercifully brief (we get one round robin that gives us a year's tedious family history); and at least two from far flung places from old chums of over 50 years long gone. Will we ever meet again? I, in turn am either equally taciturn, or promise to see two of my oldest this new year in the Kingdom - the 'Auld Grey Toun' or 'Muchty. One other important function is that while 'Books Do Furnish A Room', other than a few balls hanging up (no sniggering at the back) the cards we receive decorate the home rather well and keep reminding us of not only the ones who are still with us but also the ones who are not.

Among the many Christmas books from my two girls was one entitled 'Too Marvellous For Words' by Julie Welch. Julie is a sports journalist and the book is a memoir of her years being educated at Felixstowe College in the early 1960s. It is a wonderful, affectionate, charming, rollicking romp through these times. Which made me inevitably turn my thoughts to my schooldays from 1955 to 1961 and beyond to two reunions which I attended in 1989 and 2005. Not again, I hear you groan. Listen, dear reader, if you think you have it bad, talk to Mrs Abe. Any way, in 1989 Mrs Abe tells me I'll hate every minute of it and come back grumpy and depressed. So, what's new? So, off to Cupar, a dreary place of lamented memory but memorable for being the home of Fisher and Donaldson, makers of beautiful scotch pies. After meeting two old chums and downing a couple of lagers we trooped off to the dreaded institution - the 'old' school. This was now just a primary school. In my day it was the High School and the new one opened the year after I left. I wish I had bombed the place years before. I was greeted at the gates by an old class mate, Andrew by name, a farmer's son who had married a farmer's daughter, another old chum, Posie (do try to keep up). He immediately took me in hand and showed me round the old place. "You'll meet quite a few of your old mates", Andrew reassured me, as if to cheer me up. I did and it had the opposite effect. All the ghosts kept coming at me. Eventually I stumbled out into the daylight to be collected again by Andrew and transported to the new school where he breezily informed me I would be treated to the formal speeches and tea and cakes. On entering I was hailed by an old French teacher, still alive even now, who was surprised but glad to see me since she knew how much I had despised the dump; then I was commandeered by dear old Posie (did I mention that she and Andrew were divorced and that Posie in later years married another farmer?). I endured the speeches and enjoyed the tea and cakes and since Posie and three other ladies were at our table they were in the firing line of both my barrels And did that make me feel good? Not one bit. I felt awful. Mrs Abe was right as usual. So, boys and girls,

this is a cautionary tale. What happened in 2005, I hear you ask? You will have to wait.

Here we go again. Another one who decides to make a sneering remark about J. M. Barrie in a review of 'Peter Pan', just mentioning, for no apparent reason that I can discern, that Barrie's 'own fascination with children has raised suspicion'. By whom, I ask? Of lay people, I have probably read as much by and about Barrie as anyone and all I see is a remarkably talented, gentle, kind, generous, benevolent, philanthropist who spread much happiness and goodwill. But don't take my word for it. Listen to one who would have known. In his research for his television trilogy 'The Lost Boys', Andrew Birkin interviewed the last survivor (and Barrie's sole adopted son) of the five Llewelyn Davies boys who together constituted Peter Pan. It's pedantry time. The word 'instigate' is so often used wrongly, to mean' initiating' in any sense whatsoever when in fact it means to 'urge on', to 'incite', 'bring about' and 'instigation' means the act of inciting, especially to do wrong or cause trouble. So there.
