

JUNE'S TEAM LETTER

Happy Birthday.... Thy Kingdom Come.

This year we celebrate Pentecost on the 9th of June, 50 days after the late Easter this year. The altar frontals and celebrants will be resplendent in Red, and following the Ascension 40 days after the Resurrection, we will sing and hear of the coming of the Holy Spirit.

That first occasion was memorably recounted by Luke at the beginning of Acts, chapter 2. A large and disparate crowd gathered outside the place where disciples were waiting for the gift promised by the departing Christ. This was a more public, open, waiting than that after the crucifixion and one that attracted a wider, intrigued, or perhaps impartially interested audience.

Perhaps no one anticipated the Holy Spirit coming as a rushing wind, with tongues of flames that, rather than harm, transformed the ability of each it touched to communicate. Effectively translating words and meaning, though many different nationalities and dialects were gathered - a repurposing of the chaos of Babel.

This Holy Spirit-enhanced understanding was for one purpose; spreading the message of God's love, hope, and salvation far beyond those who had heard it to date.

Malcolm Guite's sonnet encapsulates this beautifully:

"...This is the feast of Fire, Air, Water, poured out and breathed and kindled into earth... today the Gospel crosses every border, all tongues are loosened by the Prince of Peace. Today the lost are found in his translation..."

Jesus teaches that the Holy Spirit comes in peace, as advocate and teacher, not as a threat; although our 'comfort zone' may by discomfited, by listening and acting on what we hear. This peace comes from trust, and teaches us life-changing, living love that, at our best, leads us to aspire to and practice Kingdom values every day. An invitation to us all: are you ready to celebrate?

The collect for Pentecost sums this up:

Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, ignite in us your holy fire; strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.



Acres of newsprint about the fire at Notre Dame and, by all means, rebuild it (the experts are gathering in abundance to tell the French how to do it) but let's keep a sense of perspective; it's only a building. Nobody died. However I understand that throughout the centuries people did die in its construction. When it has been resurrected any dedication should be to them.

"An investigation by the Guardian has found that 23% of the houses on Arran are used as holiday homes and as second homes. This is one of the highest rates in the UK, and is thought to be second only to St Ives in Cornwall where a "quarter of properties are holiday homes". Only 23% and 25%? Have any Guardian writers visited Southwold recently? Sheena Borthwick-Toomey, general manager for the Arran Economic Group, comments that the company wanted to avoid the "drastic measures" employed by St Ives, which banned construction of new holiday homes to prioritise homes for local people. I don't call that drastic. I call it commendable and community minded. There is no reason why it should not be adopted in Arran also.

The daft things some people say that make me chuckle. In a very interesting recent article regarding folk who forsook city drudgery for a life in the country these are a few comments: 1. A couple now in Wiltshire - "we can only live in the countryside if we're online...there's never enough time to keep up the maintenance of the old building and grounds". 2. A voluntary worker in Skye - "I don't miss the city, although the lack of bars up here took some getting used to - I do like a vodka martini." 3. Another two from Wiltshire - "We started hunting in Swindon...We happened to look at a house...half an hour outside the city. YouTube has come to the rescue many times." 4. From London - "The biggest culture shock was that we can't get sushi delivered." 5. From Norwich - "I miss drinks with colleagues and there's no Christmas party or HR Department." But I do wish all of them well and it would be interesting to see a follow-up in say, 5 years time. Country living is for life, not just for Christmas.

I have always believed that planning permission is the great leveller. From applications for the humblest of extensions to the mightiest of mansions, all are treated the same. We are, after all, only caretakers of the heritage for a short sojourn and that should be sufficient to satisfy us.
