

#### **Book Club**

At our May meeting we discussed 'The Binding' by Bridget Collins. As usual, we had a wide variety of opinions. We discussed the historical setting which was indefinable as there were no markers to indicate when and where the story was set. There were Dickensian references to a marsh landscape reminiscent of 'Great Expectations'. There was also a notable lack of religious belief which seemed at odds with the setting. The narrative explored the old craft of binding whereby secrets and wrongdoings were spoken in secret to a binder, who would write everything down and bind the memory into a book to be locked away. Once the story had been told, the storyteller lost all memory of the event. The process felt somewhere between the confessional, therapy and bullying. Binding may initially have been a benevolent act but it became apparent that the bound stories could be abused by sale to voyeuristic individuals. We liked the way the book was split into three parts but the timeline was sometimes difficult to follow. Placing the book in a particular genre was not simple: it was part realism, part fantasy, a love story that was 'bound' but transcended, and a tragedy. Some of us were captivated by the magic realism genre and the creation of a new reality, but others found the hazy setting and time manipulation at odds with engaging with characters and plot action. So much to think about with this book and it generated a lot of discussion.

We next meet on Thursday 7th July (no meeting in June) at 8 pm in the Community Centre to discuss 'Dark Angel' by Elly Griffiths.

## JUNE'S TEAM LETTER

Party like it's 1952 . . .

In case you hadn't noticed, this month sees the celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee: 70 years of remarkable service to the nation. It's a right royal excuse to get out the bunting, put out the trestle tables and have a good old shindig.

And the Jubilee – given that it's an historic occasion – is also a feast of nostalgia. In Blythburgh, we have an exhibition of photos of events in the village going back 70 years. And of course, on the telly, there's lots of grainy black and white footage, and everyone talking in that clipped way they used to on the BBC. "I em verry heppy to anince . . ." I'm not complaining. It's what we do when we celebrate big dates like that. My Mum just had her 100th birthday party, and there were loads of pictures of us lot in serial fashion disasters strung across the decades.

But the Jubilee wasn't always a tour through the archives. The original one was invented thousands of years ago, by the Israelites, when they were wandering around in the wilderness. It was more than a couple of stone tablets that Moses came down the mountain with – there was a whole system of laws about diet, marriage, worship and property.

And built into that was something called 'the Year of Jubilee'. The Israelites foresaw that – once they arrived in the Promised Land to which they were headed – each family would be given a plot, and that it wouldn't be long before some had huge tracts of land and some had none. In response they created this Jubilee.

The idea was that – every 50 years – people should put things right that had got out of kilter. Land which had been bought or taken would be given back; debts would be cancelled; prisoners pardoned, and slaves set free.

It's an extraordinary idea, encompassing the idea that God wants to see fair play, and keep things in balance. I wish we could do something like that in the here and now. The trouble is that, as far as we know, it was never implemented.

All the same, it occurs to me that something of that spirit of giving something back, of sharing what we have, should be central to our jubilee celebrations. Street parties, hog roasts – gatherings of all kinds – are a good way of binding our communities together. They also provide a valuable opportunity to find out who's not coping so well in these troubled times, and to reach out with warmth and generosity. Enjoy!
