#### Book Club

At our May meeting we discussed Merlin Sheldrake's "Entangled Lives". This was quite a daunting book to tackle and very few finished the entire book. Sheldrake has turned his PhD thesis into a best seller on how fungi is so central to our existence: it enables humans to survive and thrive, and still holds secrets and potential of enormous importance. We all agreed that there was a lot of facts and information and difficult to retain everything. We learnt that fungi has the potential to clean up building sites and can also digest plastics, pesticides and radioactive material. interesting facts we became aware of is that fungi are the largest organisms ever recorded - they enabled the first life on land and can survive in space and nuclear radiation. We enjoyed the section on the coveted truffle. The author looked at types of fungi beside human existence and truffles are non-human but are more than this because they can adapt and sense their surroundings and respond to it as if they had an intelligence. In the spirit of increasing knowledge, Sheldrake undertook an experiment with LSD and commented on the mind altering properties and the potential fungi has which is now being harnessed to treat mental health conditions.

The conclusion was that we know so little about fungi (90% of the species has not yet been documented) or how they exist, but they hold enormous potential for the future of the planet.

We next meet on Thursday 1st June at 8 pm in the Community Centre to discuss "Act of Oblivion" by Robert Harris.



#### **ABRAHAM**

I have been watching to my regret the latest adaptation of Great Expectations. What an excruciating mess. My father's family name being Pirrip, and my christian name Philip, my infant tongue could make of both names nothing longer or more explicit than Pip. So, I called myself Pip and came to be called Pip. No question then, those being the opening words of the novel that the name is Philip Pirrip. Why, therefore is Pip referred to in this adaptation as having the surname of Gargery? We have a botched suicide attempt, (Pip throwing himself off a bridge with a noose round his neck); his sister, Mrs Joe Gargery, earns a few bob by sexually chastising a man. Opium smoking abounds, including Pip, Jaggers, Estella and Miss Havisham and the 'f word is sprinkled around liberally. Now, a scripwriter is entitled to give us a dreadful drama and the BBC, foolish though they may be, are entitled to commission it. What they should not do is put Dickens name to such a travesty or call it Great Expectations.

As I sit at my keyboard and screen desperately searching for something to hold my loyal readers' attention I look behind and see a bookcase with a small but highly selective collection of sporting volumes. Golf and cricket are featured but most of all, the beautiful game. Starting with: 3 biographies of the one and only Jim Baxter, George Best, Danny Blanchflower, Trevor Brooking, 7 about Old Big 'Ead himself Brian Clough, of which the most riveting is Provided You Don't Kiss Me: 20 Years with Brian Clough by Duncan Hamilton. Duncan Hamilton has written some 17 books about various sports and I only have three, the other two being For The Glory: The Life of Eric Liddell, of which the 1924 Olympics forms but a small part, and The Footballer Who Could Fly. This is a magnificent trip down memory lane illustrating the only common interest between father and son - football. There is a particularly heartbreaking chapter entitled A Drink For Mr Baxter, Please which details an evening in a hotel bar in Nottingham with Duncan's father behind the bar serving and conversing with Jim Baxter. Jim's decline and fall through over fondness of alcohol is painfully chronicled. Terribly sad.

If you are interested in sports writing, anything, but anything by Hamilton is worth the reading. The oddity amongst the Clough collection is Be Good, Love Brian subtitled Growing up with Brian Clough by Craig Bromfield, a touching account of how Clough more or less adopted Craig and his older brother, that would see Craig live with the Clough family on and off for nine years. Moving and inspirational, this fine book shows an entirely different side to the great man. Hurrying along- two about the Cobbold brothers, two of Bobby Robson and a biog of Alf Ramsey, to remind you long-suffering Blues fans that once upon a time there were glory days. Dalglish, Greavsie, Alex James a Wembley Wizard of 1928, when Scotland stuffed England, The King (Denis Law), Jock Stein, Dunfermline Athletic, My Father and other Working Class Heroes by Gary Imlach, Those Feet-A Sensual History of English Football by David Winner, Black Boots and Football Pinks - 50 Lost Wonders of the Beautiful Game, IT'S A TEAM GAME, Scotland's Football Line-ups in the Black and White Era, Lifted Over The Turnstiles, and finally, thank goodness, I hear vou say, RANGERS An Illustrated History, to remind me when, for 5 glorious years Slim Jim was king of Ibrox Park.

Why would anyone wish to test the 'dunkability' of biscuits? Apparently, a firm called Top Rated Casinos did, recording how many dunks it took before 17 of the most popular biscuits

broke apart. In first place was a Jaffa Cake, withstanding 116 dunks and lasting 3 minutes and 16 seconds before it fell apart, with, in last place, the plain Digestive, lasting only 6 dunks and 12 seconds. You needed to know that , didn't you? In 3 minutes I would have scoffed at least two Jaffas but what sane person would want to dunk them anyway?
