## MARCH'S TEAM LETTER

I look forward to Lent every year. After I moved to Suffolk, I joined a group in Holton and subsequently reaffirmed my confirmation vows in St Mary's, Halesworth at the Easter vigil service in 1994. I still remember stepping into a bigger picture of faith and belief and owning the promises, in a new, stronger way due to God's grace guiding our learning, study and fellowship in this study group.

So, I truly associate the season of Lent as one in which to take something up: responding positively to the gift of God's son, alongside a meditative reflection on the sacrifice made by Jesus for us all. Making the most of this important time of preparation before celebrating anew the joy of our risen saviour at Eastertide. I can heartily recommend joining one of the Lent groups offered in the team.

#### **Book Club**

At our February meeting we discussed Karen Joy Fowler's "We are all Completely Beside Ourselves". This book met with a mixed reception. It tells the story of Rosie and begins in the middle of the story when she is at College in the USA, and focuses on the loss of her brother and sister. There were hints along the way, but we were quite surprised when we find that her sister was a chimpanzee and that her early life was an experiment on the part of her parents by bringing up Rosie and Fern as sisters. It is not until the end that we are shown Rosie's guilt over the loss of her 'sister' and that she told her parents she was scared of Fern. The experiment turned her father towards alcohol, her mother had a breakdown, brother Lowell joined the Animal Liberation Front and was a wanted man, and Rosie went from one disaster to another. Fern went to a sanctuary but found acceptance difficult.

Some people found the monologue style off-putting and too packed as well as being misleading but others thought that this was how memory was recovered. The book created a lot of discussion and we talked about the 1970s experiments with Apes. Most agreed that the story was intelligent, disturbing and thought-provoking but some did find the content unbelievable and irritating.

We next meet on Thursday 5th March at 8pm at the Community Centre to discuss Jane Harper's "Force of Nature".



## ABRAHAM

More philosophy from the mouth of Robert Jenrick, the Government Housing Secretary (me neither). Hearken to this meaningless piffle: 'a sense of place still matters. In our fast-paced, globalised world, identity remains important,...... most of us seek to live in a strong community, imbued with history, pride and beauty. And that theme runs through the heart of this new Conservative Government...... Now is the time to re-establish the essential bond between people and places...... I want to play my part by putting local people at the forefront of decision-making and giving them a greater say in the development of their neighbourhoods. That way, buildings can reflect the identity of their communities.' He goes on to tell us that last October he launched a brand-new National Design Guide with the proviso that 'we will expect local authorities to design their own guides in line with national standards...... If you meet these locally decided standards, the planning process must be swift and simple....... I will look carefully at the suggestion of a "fast track for beauty".' What, in heaven's name does that mean?

In 1973 Essex County Council produced a revolutionary Design Guide for Residential Areas, which was generally welcomed and adopted. It was only ever intended to prove that there is no substitute for good design, and in the beginning was a success. Unfortunately, even good architects got lazy and began overusing it with the result that Essex and the Home Counties are being crowded with 'legoland'. I will defend the planning system to the hilt relating to such matters as numbers and where to put buildings, but I believe also that good, imaginative architects (and they are out there) should be allowed to prosper.

Owner of Yorkshire Brewery Samuel Smith, one Humphrey Smith, sounds like someone I could like. In his 200-odd pubs mobile phones, laptops, tablets, even Kindles are banned, and payment in many pubs is by cash only. In 2017 he banned swearing in his pubs. If customers want to use their devices they can join the smoking outcasts outside the premises. So far, so obvious. Does this make for bad business in these houses, many of which it seems are architectural gems? Of course not, and I am willing to bet that it encourages a more discriminating type of customer. One of their pubs is the legendary Ye Olde Cheshire Cheese just off Fleet Street where you can sit where Doctor Johnson once sat and you can nip out and view his house and statue of his mog Hodge - 'a very fine cat indeed'. Mrs Abe and I have been there. A person who used to work for the company remarked "Smith said that if people in the pub had phones in front of them they should be told to put them away. It was a case of telling people how to live their lives, and on what grounds can that be reasonable?" Listen, matey, on the same grounds that if you're effing and blinding the publican is entitled to sling you out. It's my pub, my rules. If you don't like them, don't come in. Now, where can I find a Sam Smith pub?

After another Burns night at a local establishment I thought I would say a few words about the third greatest Scot of all time. There is no question that Robert was a remarkable man. The young women of Ayrshire said of him: "An hour in the dark with Rob is worth a lifetime with any other lad." There are more than 60 statues to him throughout the world, from the Americas to the Antipodes to the Sorbonne in Paris. After

Queen Victoria and Christopher Columbus Burns has more statues dedicated to him than any other non-religious figure. It was at the cottage where Burns was born (on July 21st 1801) that 5 years after his death aged 37, the first Burns Supper was held. Haggis was eaten, poems recited, songs sung and almost certainly a dram or two drunk. That evening saw the first rendition of An Immortal Memory, the now traditional speech on Burns' life and beliefs. So many more reminders of his life abound. A translation of My Heart's in the Highlands was adopted as the marching song of the Chinese resistance fighters in WW11; Beethoven attempted to write a melody for the lyrics of Auld Lang Syne; the Soviet Union was the first country to honour Burns with a commemorative stamp......and much more. In 1865, the year of his assassination, Abraham Lincoln was asked by the Washington Burns Club to attend their Supper and, if he could not, to send a message indicating "the honour of your recognition of the genius of Scotland's bard, by either a toast, a sentiment, or in any other way you deem proper". Lincoln sent his apologies and remarked: "I can not frame a toast to Burns. I can say nothing worthy of his generous heart and transcending genius. Thinking of what he has said, I cannot say anything which seems worth saying." Nor can this Abe.

So who is the second greatest Scot? My little girl texted (whatever that is) her mother to tell her that the answer to the first question in a quiz in which she was taking part up there in Orkney was A. S. Neill. Glory be. The Grand Old Man is acknowledged in Scotland. Hope springs eternal. And of course she got it right. Why wouldn't she? After all, she is her father's daughter.
