Suffolk Rusks

8 oz self-raising flour, 3 oz block (not soft tub) margarine 1 oz lard (Trex or similar if vegetarian), a pinch of salt and 1 egg beaten with a little milk and water.

Sift flour and salt into a bowl. Rub in fats until it resembles breadcrumbs. Add the beaten egg and milk/water to form a dough similar to pastry. Roll out mixture to about 1 inch thick, and cut into circles. Place on baking sheet and cook 10-12 minutes, gas mark 7,

electric 220 (reduce for fan oven)

Take out of the oven, split in half and return to oven to dry out at gas mark 2, electric 150 (lower for fan oven) for 5-10 minutes. Delicious spread with butter and served with cheese and chutney.

Book Club

At our April meeting we discussed Kate Atkinson's "Transcription". There was a huge cast of characters who were often difficult to follow. The narrative was full of intrigue and humour. We came to understand the tedium of transcribing conversations and sounds to extract meaning and intention. The story centred around Juliet who at 18 was recruited to MI5 during World War II. She was an orphan and had not completed all schooling but she was observant and quite good at disappearing into the background. The narrative was anachronistic - opening with Juliet being hit by a vehicle and then unfolding the events which led to that incident. We discussed whether Juliet's death was accidental or deliberate - she had only just returned to the UK from living abroad. We also agreed there was a confusing mix of jobs, people and ideas which made us question what was true. We discussed whether Juliet was a traitor. There was a lot of waiting around which Juliet found tedious and she could not be sure of those around her and where she fitted in. Most came from public school, Cambridge, BBC and were then recruited into MI5. One reader interpreted the narrative as commenting on the Cambridge five Soviet spies who began operating in the 1930s, noting the parallels between Juliet and these men. When Juliet became aware she turned the tables - what she saw corrupted her and she took her own revenge. Much to discuss and a very interesting book.

We next meet on Thursday 5th May at the Community Centre at 8pm.

MAY'S TEAM LETTER

Dear Friends.

The Christian Healing Ministry

What do we think it means to be well, or healthy? The World Health Organisation's definition reads: "Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity". As Christians, we need to consider how our health affects our relationships, with one another and in our communities; our relationship with the world and our environment; and our relationship with God. Before we even start to think about healing of our minds and bodies, we should consider our deepest need, which is for meaning and forgiveness through a restored relationship with our creator God, who loves us.

What is Christian Healing? The Old Testament idea of 'Shalom' conveys the idea of harmony not just within our mind and body, but with God, with one another, and with our world. It gives a sense of total wellbeing. In the New Testament, Jesus gives us a fresh understanding of God's healing touch. He sought not just people's physical healing, but to restore people's relationship with God and with others.

Christian healing is not an alternative to the essential and wonderful work done by our doctors and nurses, it supports and complements it. In the strength of God, we can have a sense of wellbeing even when we face physical illness or disability. In addition, doctors are increasingly aware that when people have a sense of wholeness and wellbeing it benefits their physical health.

In his Epistle, St. James encourages those who are suffering to avail themselves of the Church's healing ministry: anointing with holy oil, accompanied by prayer. Many people have been used by God in the healing ministry, to minister His Grace, His healing touch, His soothing anointing. Christian healing is Jesus Christ meeting you at your point of need.

Christian Healing is defined in the Church of England document 'A Time to Heal' as "progress towards health and wholeness. The process through which the individual develops a state of well-being, in harmony with God, with others and with the environment." It involves reconciliation and the restoration of our relationships with God. Jesus, through the cross, brings us back to wholeness of body, mind and spirit.

Covid permitting, it is hoped that midweek healing services (location, time, and frequency to be confirmed) will be resumed later in the year.
