NOVEMBER'S TEAM LETTER

Dear Friends,

Remember, remember, the 5th November...

I'm sure we all remember the rest of it! However, there are days in the Church's calendar for November which cause us to remember too.

The 1st November is All Saints Day, which we celebrate, in common with most parishes, on Sunday 30th October. Saints are sometimes viewed with suspicion in the Church of England, which is sad. We do not worship saints and they are not little plaster idols. We do not pray to them, although sometimes we seek their prayers for us. They are flesh and blood human beings, just like us. Many had struggles and failings; even St. Peter denied his lord, but they came good in the end, and so can we. They are the heroes of the Church, our elder sisters and brothers in the faith, and they encourage us and inspire us to strive for the holiness they attained, often at the expense of their lives.

All Souls Day is the 2nd November, which we will observe at a Team Service at Reydon at 3.00pm on Sunday 30th October. This is an occasion to remember our own departed loved ones, and there will be an opportunity to light a candle. Of course we mourn their passing, of course we miss their physical presence, but, as Christians, we do not believe that the death of the physical body is also the spiritual death of the person we loved and still love. As we remember them, in love and trust, we commend them anew to God's care and keeping and pray that, by the grace of God, we may be re-united with them, one day, in His Kingdom.

This year, Remembrance Sunday falls on the 13th November, with services across the Team. We remember those who gave their lives to defeat tyranny, ethnic slaughter, and oppression; and so that we might enjoy lives of freedom, democracy and peace. We remember them with gratitude, of course, during the two minutes silence and during the laying of poppy wreaths. We also remember them, and all the victims of war, when we work and witness in our own day to overcome division, bigotry, prejudice, and hatred of any kind.

November does indeed give us much to remember!

October 2nd saw this years' Harvest Festival; thank you to everybody who provided gifts to be donated to the local foodbank. Foodbanks are more important than ever at the moment and there is a basket at the back of the church for any donations you are able to make; these are taken to the foodbank each week. At the service we were joined by Dr Girlie Shadaya, the Principal of Amasango Career School in Grahamstown, South Africa who was visiting the UK. She spoke about the current challenges the school faces, her future hopes, and also the impact harvest has upon her learners in a particularly poor part of South Africa. On 9th October, we commemorated the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams who composed so much well-known church music, especially through his editing of the English Hymnal. All the music sung and played at the service was written or arranged by RVW, and the sermon explored the relationship between faith and creativity.

On Sunday November 13 we will hold our Remembrance Service. The Act of Remembrance begins at 10.50am at the War Memorial, and continues with a service in church.

November's coffee morning will take place on Wednesday 16th November at 10.30am. Tea, coffee and cakes will be on offer and there will be a raffle too.

We are holding a Christmas raffle for church funds. The prize is a food hamper, and tickets, priced at £1.00, will be available in church each Sunday and from the Village Store and Farm Shop. The draw will take place at the Carol Service in church on December 18th.

Finally, for some time now we have been unable to fly a flag due to issues in the church tower, but thanks to Mike Barber, we now have a new flagpole installed at the front of the church. We would like to thank Mike for erecting the flagpole so quickly, and in time to honour the late Queen Elizabeth II. The flagpole came from Lady P's house and we are sure that Lady P will be pleased that this has helped the church. It was gifted to us by Dr Catherine Thomas of Suffolk Exotic Vets, and we would like to thank Dr Thomas for her generosity.

Maureen Alice Beales RIP

A memorial service for Maureen, who died on June 29th aged 91, took place on September 9th at St Peter and St Paul, Wangford, attended by a large congregation of family, friends and former colleagues. Born in Peterborough in 1930, Maureen won a scholarship to the local grammar school, followed by secretarial college. She worked for architects and accountants, but had the most fun when she joined Great Eastern Railways, working with one of the first female civil engineers, and, ever practical, taking advantage of discounted rail fares.

Maureen and Peter met at a dance, and, after he qualified as a Geography teacher, they moved to Humber Doucy Lane, Ipswich, round the corner from his first job at Northgate School. Peter moved to Woodbridge School in the late 1960s, and then to Ipswich School, where, from 1977 he became a housemaster, living in a school house.

Maureen and Peter had two sons, Nicholas and Duncan, and a daughter, Bryony, and were a very active family, enjoying travel, cycling and camping.

Peter took early retirement in 1988 following his cancer diagnosis, and they moved to 1 Church Street, Wangford, where they set up a tea room with Duncan. Sadly Peter's cancer returned in 1991, and the business closed. Peter died in 1992.

Maureen, in need of a job, went to work as a receptionist at the firm where Bryony was employed, remaining there until her retirement. Bryony recalls that watching her mother get to grips with a computer for the first time was very funny.

When she finally retired, Maureen threw herself into a very active life. She continued to travel, cycling and camping in Europe until her mid-80s; she was still cycling at the end of 2021. She went to keep fit classes, and WEA courses, and kept up her musical interests, playing viola in her Ipswich orchestra and a string quartet, and enjoying recorder ensembles.

Maureen also became involved with Wangford church, where her practical and organisational skills were put to good use. She was a churchwarden for many years, as well as sacristan, unofficial verger, brass polisher and cleaner. As keyholder for many years, she ensured that, come rain or shine, the church was opened and closed daily. Through the church she met Robin Chater, and they became a powerful team, who quietly got on with whatever was needed to keep the ship afloat.

Maureen joined Robin in developing the Village Pantry at the Henham Steam Rallies; she was a very successful recruiter, with a gift for getting, and keeping, people involved. After handing over the well-oiled machine to Sara, Maureen was still helping out in the kitchen cabin at the last pre-covid Rally in 2019.

Maureen was a good friend to many, and was generous in passing on her knowledge and skills. She was a loving and supportive mother, grandmother of four, and great-grandmother of six. She hated fuss, and her equable temperament was an example to others. She saw the best in everyone, and never took offence. Like a superannuated girl guide, she had a can-do, positive attitude, a great sense of humour, and a remarkable energy and zest for life that belied her years.

Although Maureen cared for Robin as his health declined, she would have hated having to be cared for herself. That her final illness was mercifully short was a blessing for her.

Donations in Maureen's memory were made to Cancer Research.



Book Club

At our September meeting we discussed Ruth Ware's "The Death of Mrs Westaway". We all felt there was a strange compulsion to continue reading this book despite the somewhat bizarre tale of life, relationships and dysfunctional families. The context and setting seemed out of time with the narrative and the characters were not believable. The story unfolds through Hal who was only 18 when her mother died. Hal works on Brighton Pier as a tarot reader and we did find some of the tarot related points interesting but some of the connections she made using the cards were quite spurious. The arrival of an unexpected letter telling her of an inheritance set off a chain of events. She has no money or family to fall back on and decides to carry on being the person the letter was sent to. We wondered why the family did not question who she was but welcomed her into the home of the late Mrs Westaway. Relationships between the Westaway adult children were tense. Tales of difficult and unloving childhoods were unveiled. Hal began to piece together who her father was and that her mother's death was not an accident. There were many twists and turns and the author did keep us guessing as to the true nature of Hal's background and why she was being hunted down so relentlessly.

We discussed whether fiction had to be believable. There were aspects of the narrative and technique reminiscent of Daphne du Maurier and Agatha Christie. Gothic conventions abounded - woman (young) in distress, the supernatural and omens (via the tarot cards). Trepassen House was not a castle but it was dark and foreboding and contained secrets. In summary, a discordant narrative that conversely we just had to read.

We next meet on Thursday 3rd November at 8 pm at the Community Centre to discuss "Fatal Inheritance" by Rachel Rhys.
