

In a documentary about Manchester City Football Club, it was apparently revealed that City employ someone to switch on the players' cars, so as to save them time and warm up their vehicles after training. Who said footballers were spoiled and pampered? All together now - Give Me Strength

As of the late Lord Longford, we're all asking the wrong about question Johnson. Look, we know he's a scruffy-haired buffoon - but is he right?

One of my many failings is that I have never been over adventurous regarding travelling to foreign climes. For sure I have seen Spain (disastrous - best forgotten), Ireland (Dublin - marvellous) and Paris (beautiful), and I hope to return to these two wonders some day. I would have loved to have seen Paris when but a boy, for as Hemingway remarked, If you are lucky enough to have lived in Paris as a young man, then wherever you go for the rest of your life, it stays with you, for Paris is a moveable feast. In the main, though, I am content with my immediate environs, with the occasional sortie to Andrews, Orkney and the countryside of old Blighty. Let us face it, for a man who comes over dizzy when leaving Wangford, distant lands hold no attraction for me. (I do travel to Aldeburgh once a week- quite enough for me). How often have I heard it said that one should step outside one's comfort zone. Why? I have spent many years creating my comfort zone and am in no hurry to relinquish it. You may regard this as ridiculously parochial. Well, so be it. If you are planning your next trip to the North Pole, I may even wish you bon voyage as I sip my parochial gin and tonic looking out of the Swan on to Southwold Market Place. But consider this; while you are stravaiging (Ed - wandering about aimlessly) round the positively world, I feel virtuous knowing that your carbon footprint is doing untold damage to mother earth while mine makes the minutest impression.

Once more, struggling for an end piece for these jottings, one presented itself for all the wrong reasons.

On 7th September, Philip Hayes died. I like to believe that I knew Philip. But, did I? For sure it was he and my other chum, Mike Ryland, who aroused my interest (one night in the late lamented Angel) in joining the Parish Council, and I thank them for that. I imagine there was a lot more, but from all accounts a full. well-led life. I liked him and he was my friend and, for me, that will always be enough. May God bless you Phil; rest in peace.
