OCTOBER'S TEAM LETTER

- 6 And the LORD God prepared a gourd, and made it to come up over Jonah, that it might be a shadow over his head, to deliver him from his grief. So Jonah was exceeding glad of the gourd.
- 7 But God prepared a worm when the morning rose the next day, and it smote the gourd that it withered.
- 8 And it came to pass, when the sun did arise, that God prepared a vehement east wind; and the sun beat upon the head of Jonah, that he fainted, and wished in himself to die, and said, It is better for me to die than to live. (The Book of Jonah Chapter 4)

I am feeling a little like the prophet Jonah in his sorrow for the gourd. I planted a small Christmas tree in the vicarage garden, my contribution to the Queen's green canopy. But the extreme heat of our long hot summer in July and August has killed it, and like Jonah's gourd it has turned brown and withered.

October is the month in which many of our churches will be celebrating harvest. But it has been a very challenging harvest for farmers across Europe. We have experienced the hottest summer and the worst drought for over 500 years. Crop yields are down across all sectors and prices are up. Against this background we are increasingly aware of the fragility of our way of life, the reality of climate change and the inevitability of having to live a simpler life, thankful for the gift of enough.

At St Mary's Uggeshall harvest festival on October 9th we are welcoming a guest speaker from the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institute, who will talk about their work in supporting farmers. It can be a lonely profession, and when harvests suffer, economic pressures can build up. We therefore give thanks for all who produce our food, and we pray for them.

The Old Testament prophets such as Jonah might have looked upon our world as it currently is, and they might speak of judgement. War in Ukraine, climate change, the real pressures of the increasing cost of living all have the appearance of the disasters that befell God's people in Old Testament times. But when Jonah looked forward to the destruction of evil Nineveh he was disappointed. The people repented, amended their ways and turned back to God. A merciful God forgave Nineveh and a new start was possible.

There may be current pressures and challenges ahead for us, but we too can turn back to God and find help in Him. I am reminded again of the poem by Gerard Manley Hopkins; 'God's Grandeur' speaks of the wornness of tired earth, and the promise of renewal through the grace of God.

The world is charged with the grandeur of God.

It will flame out, like shining from shook foil;

It gathers to a greatness, like the ooze of oil

Crushed. Why do men then now not reck his rod?

Generations have trod, have trod, have trod;

And all is seared with trade; bleared, smeared with toil;

And wears man's smudge and shares man's smell: the soil

Is bare now, nor can foot feel, being shod.

And for all this, nature is never spent;
There lives the dearest freshness deep down things;
And though the last lights off the black West went
Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs —
Because the Holy Ghost over the bent
World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.

Book Club

At our September meeting we discussed 'Sixteen Horses' a debut novel by Greg Buchanan. The story began with finding 16 horse heads strategically placed in a field with their single eyes facing the sun. There were lots of characters, none likable, and at times, unbelievable. The descriptive language around the environment was good but the character dialogue was ambiguous and often contradictory. It became difficult to know which voices could be trusted. Many people thought the book was gratuitously violent, not stopping at the decapitation of the horses. There was murder, lies, self-mutilation and anthrax poisoning. Closure came from knowing that the policeman's 17 year old son had carried out the violent acts which started when he was stopped from seeing his 16-year old girlfriend who was rather fond of horses. He took his revenge on the entire village and it became a lost place. We questioned whether there were any truths and concluded we could not rely on the memory and the shifting views of the characters. An unsettling book.



I finally managed to reach the end of the top shelf in my trawl through my biogs and here they are, with some comments. The Beatles - lots, but the only one that grabbed me was One Two Three Four - The Beatles In Time by Craig Brown, who, I believe, lives in Aldeburgh. This is a rip-roaring read crammed with interesting snippets designed to delight even the doubters. The diaries of Cecil Beaton, fashion designer, photographer, etc gossipy and uninteresting; and Tony Benn, much like himself boring. 4 books about the talented Irish family the Behans, especially the roistering Brendan-"When I came back to Dublin, I was courtmartialled in my absence and sentenced to death in my absence, so I said they could shoot me in my absence". What is it about dissolute Celts that make them so interesting? I feel I would have liked Bacon, Behan, Donleavy and Burns but not one on whom I have 10 (yes, 10) volumes, the weaselly drunken Welsh poet, Dylan Thomas. Something now that is much more pleasant - Adrian Bell : Voice of the Countryside, apprentice farmer, recording East Anglian country life, writing for the Eastern Daily Press for more than 30 years and composing the first Times crossword puzzle. Get copies of his great trilogy (Corduroy, Silver Ley and The Cherry Tree) if you can wonderful reading. Oh yes, also father of Martin Bell, the man in the white suit. Doorstep volumes about and by, Alan Bennett. Never seemed to do it for me but Mrs Abe loves him. A smashing little treatise entitled Architecture For Pleasure by my chum and architect John Bennett. I do not pretend to understand it all but it fascinated me anyhow. You can buy a copy from John at his studio. Two books about one of the great songwriters of the 20th Century, Irving Berlin. They don't make them like that any more. Finally, the best of them all? Difficult to say but right up there. For delightful reading, pick up anything by Ronald Blythe; Akenfield for sure but also a super one is The Time By The Sea Aldeburgh 1955-1958, when he was drawn into the artistic circle of the Aldeburgh Music Festival of Britten and Pears. Still with us at the age of 99. I bet you can hardly wait for shelf 2, starting with Dirk Bogarde, ending with Andrew Devonshire.

A television drama over four episodes we had the misfortune to watch in August with the leads played by two fine actors, Nicola Walker and Sean Bean, was entitled yes, you knew I was going to say, Marriage. This was the most stultifying, mindnumbing piece of television hokum I have seen in a long time, if ever. The dialogue was drivel, the plotline such as it was nonexistent, and the acting incredulous. Four hours of my life I shall never see again. I suppose I should feel for the actors being given a script so banal and dull. After the first episode we vowed not to go on and then relented and watched all three remaining at once, hoping it would improve. It didn't. Mrs Abe commented that if our marriage had been like that she would have shot herself long ago. Or did she mean me? Whatever. Two Times reviewers thought it was terrific, a true picture of marital status. Did we watch the same programme? Have we got this all wrong? Tell me. If you feel like replying perhaps the sainted editor might find space for a couple of your responses.

I never had the opportunity to tread the hallowed halls of one of the ancient universities but I'm sure in the event I would have floundered, being remarkably immature for so long. However I savoured the experience vicariously later in life when my little girl attended the, to my mind, most venerated of the great institutions - St Andrews. I often pondered whether or not she enjoyed her student days beside the barbarians (note: there are more non-scots at St Andrews than jocks or jockettes). I found the answer some years ago when I heard a programme on Radio Orkney entitled Musical Milestones, a sort of Desert Island Discs with only the subject presenting the chat and music. Frances it was, and she confessed that she loved her time as a student. She also let it out that her dad can't sing. True enough. Mentioning DID, there was one Christmas a special edition featuring members of the public and their favourite pieces of music, hosted by Kirsty Young and yes, Frances was featured. She was the only one who was favoured with two discs. Thank you for reading this unashamed dollop of pride and nostalgia.
