SEPTEMBER'S TEAM LETTER

'tis good Lord to be here'

These words are from an old hymn whose lyrics retell the story of the Transfiguration - a mystical event in the life of Jesus when he was on a mountain with his closest disciples Peter, James and John and suddenly Jesus was transfigured by a brilliant light and two ethereal figures appeared, who we are told are Moses and Elijah. Peter is so overwhelmed by the experience that he suggests that he builds three tents for Jesus, Moses and Elijah to mark the event as a permanent memorial, as he exclaims 'it's good Lord to be here'. The Transfiguration is viewed as such an important event that it appears in the Christian calendar twice each year. Once on the last Sunday before Lent and also in the height of summer in August.

I have just returned to work after three months Sabbatical and there have been several times during my time away when I have felt moved to feel, it is indeed 'good Lord to be here'.

I began the sabbatical by leading an ecumenical group to the Holy Land and I think everyone who joined the pilgrimage really enjoyed and found the experience rewarding. There were twenty three of us in the group and four clergy so we were able to share out the opportunities for worship between us. I found the worship particularly moving as we broke bread together in the Shepherds' Fields in Bethlehem, in the Church of the Good Shepherd in Jericho, on the Mount of Beatitudes, overlooking the Sea of Galilee, and as we renewed our baptismal promises in the River Jordan. It was also good to share meals and times relaxing in the bar together.

I also benefitted from spending an extra week in Jerusalem after the pilgrimage concluded, which was the first time I have ever been in the Holy land without leading a group of students or adults. I returned to Bethlehem to meet with some Palestinian Christians at the WI'AM Centre for peace and reconciliation. Going on public transport, as opposed to a tour bus, walking through the heavily guarded checkpoint and making my own way to the centre was harrowing and unnerving. Not least because the checkpoint is located next to the Separation Wall which so cruelly divides The West Bank from Israel. I had time to visit Banksy's aptly named 'Wall Off Hotel' which is both a hotel, exhibition and museum space. I visited the Refugee Camp called Aida which has existed since 1950 and was built by the U.N. to house refugees who lost their homes and land in the War of Independence in 1948. There are severe restrictions placed upon people in the West Bank where access to water and electricity is strictly controlled by the Israeli Government. Currently with the war in Ukraine and political instability in Israel it seems that a peaceful settlement between Jew and Arab remains a distant dream.

I am now beginning to plan to lead a Pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela in 2024 following the French Camino and details will follow soon.

I am very grateful to the clergy, Churchwardens and PCCs who covered for me during the Sabbatical and enabled me to have such a wonderful set of experiences. I received a very warm welcome back at the Team Service on 31st July and again I felt 'it's good Lord to be here'. I hope you all have had a blessed summer.

Book Club

At our August meeting we discussed "The Second Sleep" by Robert Harris. The book was described as a "thriller" but we found it to be much more than that, and it generated a bit of discussion. There was a gripping start and many of us had to go back over the text to check what we were reading. The story opened in an undeterminable time with a young cleric on a journey by horse to carry out the funeral of a deceased priest. The language was archaic as was the description as we entered a world where the church was paramount and freedoms were minimal. At the point of finding plastic and glass we questioned what we thought we were reading, and it made us stop and think when the symbol for hubris and blasphemy was found - an apple with a bite taken out. We wondered if this was a comment on technology or the garden of Eden and the challenge for God's knowledge. It became apparent that the world had regressed and freedoms were minimal with servitude the norm. We entered a strange world following an apocalypse so that modern ways of living were finished. Death was a real risk for searching for our everyday objects. We talked about the relationship between church and state, loss of freedoms and how the possibilities in this book never seemed that far away. There had been atrocities in the past (this time was our present) and the cleric looked for evidence and began to question the unquestionable where independent thinking was forbidden and dangerous. We talked about speculative fiction where some of the events and situations felt that they could be real even though the setting and time were An interesting book and very well written not.

We next meet on Thursday 1^{sr} September at 8 pm in the Community Centre to discuss Greg Buchanan's "Sixteen Horses".

Ride and Stride 10th September 2022

The Annual Sponsored Ride and Stride is a national event, and every second Saturday in September cyclists and walkers all round the country are out making money for their local county Churches Trust. Ride and Stride's sister event, the Pedal and Drive for vintage and classic cars, is held on the same day. The idea started in Suffolk, and consistently Suffolk has headed the table of funds raised. The Ride and Stride is the main source of income to Suffolk Historic Churches Trust to enable it to make grants to churches and chapels of all denominations towards repair and restoration costs. Ride and Stride is run entirely by volunteers and is inter-denominational, with participants sponsored for each place of worship visited between 9.00am and 5.00pm on Ride and Stride Day or with a donation, regardless of the number of churches visited.

The money raised by each cyclist or walker is shared equally between the Suffolk Historic Churches Trust and the place of worship nominated by the participant.

As important as the participants are the many volunteers who give up the day to man the churches and chapels and sign in the cyclists and walkers as they arrive. Hundreds of places of worship are manned during the day and that takes quite a team of volunteers!
